

What does a Hurst Challenge Grade Report look like?

The following is an example of a Challenge Grade report for Physics and English Language and Literature

Subject	Teacher	C Grade	Score	Comment
Physics	JLR	A	+1	Tom, you have recorded promising results in all the mini-tests this term. However, the final module is slightly more challenging. Keep reviewing definitions, units and practice questions as they arise. Well done.
English	RT	A *	-1	Tom, you are a good student. If you wish to bag two A*s, however, you need to make your timed essay responses even more detailed; you are getting there.

Example of comments by a tutor on a Challenge Grade Report

Tom - you are bright enough to pick up from these comments, that there is still a lot of work to be done before you go into the exams to make sure that you are able to hit your target grades.

Social and recreation time have to go on a 'back-burner' - you must now plan your days around lessons and revision.

Just those two things.

That way, collecting your results in three and a half months will be a happy experience!

Another example of comments by a tutor on a Challenge Grade Report

Well done Claire, another strong performance in a Challenge Grade review. Over the last few weeks I have noticed how hard you have been working, particularly on your prep. I often see you working on it in Shield in your free time.

Mathematics is the one subject that I would like you to really focus on for at least the rest of this term. This year has seen quite a few scores below your challenge grade and its important that you make up this ground now; it will be a big effort but you will be pleased with the result.
