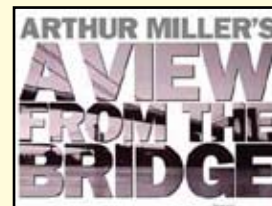

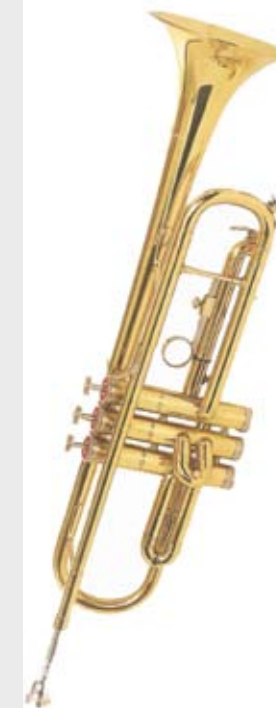

Thursday 5th March

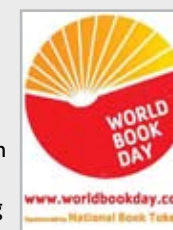
To celebrate World Book Day, Dominique Collins and the team from the LRC will mount a competition for pupils, following on from the popular Treasure Hunt of 2008.

Full details will be available in due course from the LRC and via the LRC VLE.

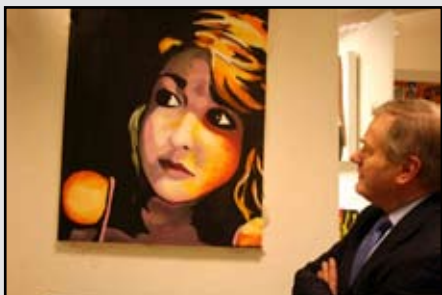

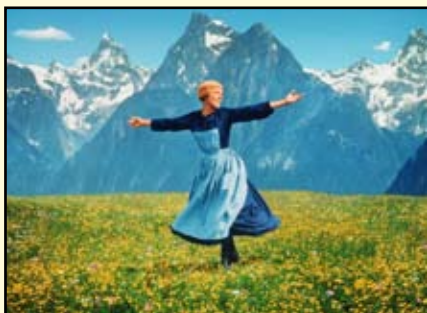
