# Basic School Fees

## 2025/26

Termly Fees inclusive of VAT<sup>1</sup> and lunch<sup>2</sup>.

Termly Fees (including regular boarding charges) are charged in advance and are due on the first day of term.

### Included within the termly fee

We aim to make our fees as comprehensive as possible and to incorporate the cost of all the major mandatory expenses incurred by our pupils. Thus, the basic termly fee covers:

The cost of tuition and all associated costs (including books and materials, the cost of educational trips and visits on compulsory academic subjects)

All meal costs and, where appropriate, boarding charges

A range of after school activities in the Junior Prep School

The provision of a College laptop for the pupil's own personal use

Basic charges for the Combined Cadet Force

The cost of personal accident insurance (including dental cover) and, for pupils in the Senior School, personal effects insurance

Membership of the College's alumni association

The pupil's subscription to the Independent Schools' Careers Organisation

# Additional Options

## 2025/26

Additional boarding options are available to pupils in the Senior School and Sixth Form. Extra tuition in Music, Drama and Dance are available to pupils in all years. Extra tuition fees are charged in arrears.

# Deposits and Discounts

## 2025/26

Deposits are required prior to entry at Hurst. Sibling discounts are offered to families with two or more children at the College.

Deposit (UK residents)	£1,000	The deposit is a one-off charge payable prior to entry and is retained until the pupil leaves the College.
Deposit (Non-UK residents)	£12,000	
Commitment Fee	£2,000	The commitment fee is a one-off charge payable with the deposit which is refunded when the pupil joins the College.

### Endowment Fund

The College's Endowment Fund was created in 2002 in order to provide future assistance to enable talented children who would not otherwise be able to join the College. It takes the form of an entirely voluntary donation by parents for a suggested amount of £50 per term, per family. The £50 will be included on your first bill, but if you wish to opt out you need only write to the Finance Office. However, we hope that as many of you as possible will feel able to contribute. If you do, we would also ask that you complete a Gift Aid Declaration Form (available from the Finance Office) as this enables the College to reclaim the basic rate tax paid on the contributions you make. If you are a higher-rate tax payer, it will also enable you to reclaim the difference between the basic and higher rate of tax paid on the donation. The College is extremely grateful to those who are able to support the fund.

Sibling discounts	
<b>All Schools</b>	
Where two or more children from the same immediate family attend the College at the same time the basic fees of all the siblings will be discounted as follows.	
Two siblings attending at the same time	- 2.5%
Three siblings attending at the same time	- 7.5%
Four siblings attending at the same time	- 12.5%

# Insurances

## 2025/26

Some insurances are included with the basic school fees, whilst others are available to parents as optional extras.

### **Personal Accident Insurance**

*All pupils automatically covered.*

Provides cover in the event of a serious accident which results in permanent disability, including damage or loss of teeth and any associated dental treatment. Details of the cover provided, and instructions for making claims, will be available on the Parent Portal dashboard.

### **Travel Insurance**

*All pupils automatically covered.*

The College has a blanket policy which covers all pupils in Senior and Prep Schools travelling with the school, which includes trips abroad and ski trips, etc. The only activities that are not covered are those classified as dangerous, such as white-water rafting and bungee jumping, and top up cover can be arranged for these if necessary. Children with pre-existing medical conditions may be covered but confirmation should always be sought from the insurers. For this reason, and in case there is a need to arrange supplemental cover, parents should always familiarise themselves with the terms of the policy in advance of any school trip.

### **Personal Effects Insurance**

*Optional/Senior School pupils automatically covered.*

Provides cover for damage or loss to your child's personal belongings (except mobile phones) during term time. See the table opposite for the cost.

There are limits to the cover provided, details of which (including the excess applicable) will be available on the Parent Portal dashboard together with instructions for making claims.

### **Pupil Absence Insurance Scheme**

*Additional cost—see table opposite.*

Provides refunds of fees where the pupil is away from College due to illness or accidental injury for four consecutive days or more (including weekends) and with a maximum refund period of 280 days, although pre-existing conditions are not covered. It includes payment of up to six termly fees on the accidental death of the fee payer(s). Charged termly in advance.

### **Private Healthcare Insurance**

*Additional cost—see table opposite.*

Provides the usual cover for the cost of medical expenses with the usual limitations. However, pre-existing conditions are covered and no previous medical history is required. Charged termly in advance.

The cost of mandatory personal accident insurance including emergency dental cover, and, for Senior School pupils, personal effects insurance is included in the basic fee (see page 2). Information about these insurances is on the College website.

### **Schools Fees Insurance**

*Additional cost—see table opposite.*

Available to parents. Provides life cover, together with a critical illness option, to meet a large proportion of the pupil's future fees up to age 18 upon the death of the principal breadwinner. ### Monthly payments

Although all fees are due on the first day of term, the College offers two monthly payment options for parents paying by Direct Debit.

Option 1: Under this arrangement the termly fees for the year are collected by 10 equal payments (which are set at approximately 10% of the basic annual fees) commencing on 28 July (or thereabouts) and monthly thereafter until 28 April of the following year, with a further balancing payment (to allow for extras, etc.) on 28 May. There is no charge for this arrangement.

Option 2: Under this arrangement, which is provided by School Fee Plan, the termly fees are collected in 12 payments, commencing on 1 August (or thereabouts) and monthly thereafter until July of the following year. There is a charge for this arrangement.
